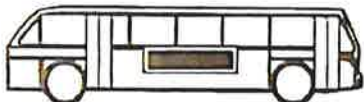

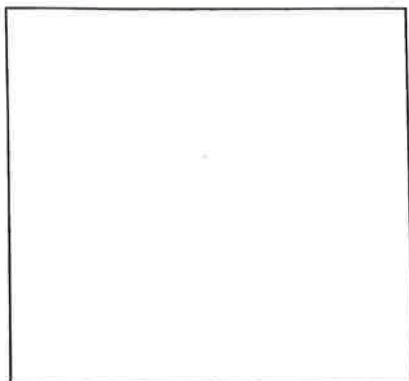

Dear KRSC,

Things are going well in the Across the Rivers Area. Our activities subcommittee has planned out a fish fry for our summer function, and I brought some flyer for that today. It will be August 24th at Scales Lake in Boonville, IN.

The PR subcommittee did finally wrap up all remaining business with the funds requested last year to send Basic Texts to our area jails and for a flyer blitz in our area. There was \$328.25 remaining in unused funds from this endeavor, which I returning today. Our PR subcommittee also has a new proposal and requests for funds for a project that I will bring up in new business.

There is a jail in Webster County, Kentucky that reached out, I believe to NAWS, which got redirected to us, looking for some sort of NA participation in their county jail, perhaps in the form of an H&I panel, and at the very least some literature. We discussed this at our ASC meeting last week, and it wasn't clear as to whether this jail is part of ATRA or PANA, so we decided as an area to bring this information to this meeting today to try and coordinate with PANA area and see what their thoughts on it were. Our H&I subcommittee chair has the willingness to help out, and it was even suggested that maybe this could be a joint ATRA/PANA effort, in the spirit of unity, since this county seems to be right in between the two areas?

I also have info from Joe G regarding the website he sent with me today to pass along to the executive committee, as well as a small refund from the KRCNA 33 PO box.

Phoneline is functioning as expected.

The current cost averages \$45 a month with each additional line that we add to it costing an additional \$5 more per month.

Treasurer Roxanne L has successfully moved the payment method from my credit card (Shane C) to the Regional Bank Account.

We recently set up a new Phoneline for PIRANA, and it is functioning to their specifications.

Every Area in the Region has a functioning phoneline except Unity Area and the newly joined SCURA Area (West Virginia). I have spoken with both of these Areas about setting up an extension for them when they are ready. I need direction from these service bodies on when and how to move forward.

We regularly receive calls on the main line 833-NAKENTUCKY for the Kentuckiana Region. We are either directing callers to the appropriate website or phoneline for their location in Kentuckiana, or connecting callers directly to established members that we know in these locations that the callers are (12 step call style). The only Areas in Kentuckiana that we are aware of that do not have functioning phonelines are the Pennyrle Area and Owensboro. We have offered to help them both before and have been unsuccessful. Our hope to reach out again and get them up and running.

We are very close to finishing the YAP (automated phoneline) installation.

We lack 2 steps in this process:

- * making sure all areas have functioning phonelines, or are comfortable with the general statewide line fielding calls for them
- * - pointing the Twilio service to all of the area phonelines to connect the bmit database and the phonelines through the automatic forwarding software
 - Twilio is the paid service software that connects the bmit database to our actual phonelines and sends the data that the caller is requesting back and forth between the bmit and phoneline. (its the computer voice on the call that asks whether you want meeting information or to speak to a volunteer, and then routes the call appropriately. It also sends the SMS (text) messages with the meeting information to the caller.
 - currently this service is being paid for on the Regional Webservant's credit card and needs to be moved to the regional bank account
 - Twilio is quite inexpensive. Most service bodies using it that we know of pay less than \$50 a month for multiregional phonelines (including Texas, North Carolina, and Northern New York). The cost is based on number of SMS messages sent and minutes used during the calls.

Our hope is that we can show some of this progress to our friends across the State of Kentucky and Surrounding Areas and move forward with a solid plan for executing statewide Public Relations efforts to help the addict that still suffers.

Please reach out to me with any questions.

I would like to volunteer to host the February KBARNA meeting in Lexington. I would like to have some concrete Public Relations project proposals to present at that time including:

- statewide billboards
- bus/bus stop signs
- social media/tv/radio PSA's (we have purchased all of the necessary equipment/software and are coordinating with NAWS and other regions around the globe on this project)
- statewide professionals PR day (hopefully in Frankfort or Louisville)
- a literature Outreach project where PR would make connections with organizations all around KBARNA boundaries and send needed literature to these organizations

We would like to begin a monthly online PR/FD committee meeting for the KBARNA participants in order to begin building lasting ties in our combined service efforts. Meeting every 6 months and expecting to succeed in these types of coordinated pr efforts will never work. The KSA meets monthly with other Regional, Zonal, and NAWS level committees. We want to get to work with the KBARNA participants on the same timetable because this is our home. I am willing to personally train anyone who is interested in how to log on and participate in a Zoom meeting. And if necessary, I am willing to provide the necessary equipment to host a group "hybrid meeting" which includes a webcam and microphone.
